



2013 Point in Time Quick Facts

Populations Counted:

<u>Literally Homeless:</u>	Persons living on the street, in Transitional Housing, or Shelter. ➤ <u>This DOES NOT include persons who are doubled up.</u>
<u>Formerly Homeless:</u>	Persons living in Permanent Supportive Housing.

Results:

<u>Literally Homeless:</u>	6859 Literally Homeless Persons were counted; this is a <u>decrease of 1.4 percent</u> from the 2012 PIT count.
-----------------------------------	---

- There were **decreases** in the number of Unsheltered Persons, Singles Adults in Transitional Housing, and Families in Emergency Shelter.
- There were **increases** in the number of Single Adults in Emergency Shelter and Families in Transitional Housing.

<u>Formerly Homeless:</u>	3690 Formerly Homeless Individuals and 983 Formerly Homeless Families were counted.

Subpopulations

2478 Homeless Youths* were counted in Shelter and Transitional Housing Programs:

- 2460 were in Transitional and Emergency Shelter Programs for Singles and Families
- 18 were persons living on the street

<u>Minors residing in Shelter or Transitional Housing with their parents or other adult guardian</u>	1868 (1880 in 2012)
<u>Adult-Youths aged 18 to 24</u>	604 (158 Singles and 446 Persons in Families)
<u>Unaccompanied Minor Children</u>	6 (12 in 2012 and 26 in 2011)

**The Homeless Services CoC defines Homeless Youth as persons aged 0 to 24 years; therefore the count of Homeless Youth will not be equal to the count of Homeless Minor Children – persons aged 0 to 17 years.*

1851 Chronically Homeless persons were counted:

<u>Single Adults:</u>	1768
<u>Adults in Families:</u>	83

499 Homeless Veterans were counted:

<u>Single Adults:</u>	473
<u>Adults in Families:</u>	26
