Meeting Notes

WELCOME AND AGENDA REVIEW

While members of the ERSO Committee gathered, Synina Pugh (ERSO Advisor, ICH) led an icebreaker.

To officially open the meeting, co-chairs Reginald Black (PFFC) and Tony Newman (Deputy FSA Administrator – Individuals, DHS) introduced themselves. Additionally, Reggie reviewed the agenda for the meeting, and Synina provided an overview of ICH meeting conventions.

II. SYSTEM CHECK-IN

System check-ins allow the ICH to track shifts in the landscape and better understand current trends. Two (2) topics were flagged for the check-in: 1) Operational Shifts regarding Tornado Warnings and Fast-Moving Thunderstorms and 2) Other Constituent Concerns.

A. OPERATIONAL SHIFTS RE TORNADO WARNING & FAST-MOVING THUNDERSTORM

Reggie framed the issue from the perspective of unsheltered constituents impacted by the emergency weather event. Synina proposed key questions to support Planning for Extreme Weather and invited Ms. Umi and Jean Badalamenti (DCPL) to provide additional context.

Comments, concerns, and questions from the discussion are captured on slide 11 - 16. Topic areas are summarized here for easy reference:

- Significant communication issues related to:
 - \circ $\;$ The evolving nature of the emergency and the resources available, as well as
 - Communication with staff responsible for enforcing the closure of the library.
- Emergency planning for unsheltered clients:
 - Concern that HSEMA is not at ERSO meetings directly hearing from constituents with lived experience.
 - Need to avoid or mitigate design decisions that create buildings susceptible to tornadoes. E.g., utilization of glass for neighborhood public libraries and the new 801 East Shelter
- Recommendations:

- Evaluate options for leveraging vacant spaces, including the DC Armory
- Leverage church and faith-based institutions

B. OTHER CONSTITUENT CONCERNS

Due to limited time and the robust discussion on operational shifts, the co-chairs shifted to the Discussion items.

III. DISCUSSION: WINTER PLANNING

Synina Pugh facilitated the discussion on FY24 Winter Planning which focused on:

- Updating the Short-Fall Estimates and
- Planning for Overflow Locations

See slides 18 - 21 for the details of the ICH presentation. Comments, concerns, and questions from the discussion are captured on slide 11 - 16. Topic areas are summarized here for easy reference:

- Demand for shelter:
 - Concern about updating the shortfall estimates given the uptick of utilization for Day Service Centers reported by Miriam's Kitchen and Georgetown Ministries Center
- Available Shelter:
 - Concern that specialized beds from 801 East are counted as available for response to hypothermia alerts.
 - o Question about how capacity at the Aston is factored into the Winter Plan
 - Concern that Blair will be undergoing renovations sooner.
 - Clarification that this is likely, not true.
- PEPV Demobilization:
 - Concern about the timeline and housing placement activities
 - Request to extend PEPV operations.
- Recommendation to change tax regime for hotels in exchange for lower rental prices.
- Question about standard/minimum specs for an overflow location
 - Contact DHS for details as this is not straightforward; DHS applies a matrix approach based on the spatial configuration and potential of each site identified as available for overflow operations.
