- Importance of understanding FY23 priorities/projects across all workgroups/committees before deciding on Executive Committee priorities/projects
- Issues that are top of mind for meeting participants, including: prevention and upstream work, aging
  population & complex medical health concerns, DV and safety-related issues, client-facing communications,
  focusing on what is in the control of the ICH and homeless services, and importance of prioritizing
  consumer/client concerns

#### C. FULL COUNCIL MEETINGS
