III. DISCUSSION

There were three (3) topics for discussion, including the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Continuum of Care (CoC) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), ICH nominations and governance topics, and preparation for the next ICH Full Council meeting.

A.HUD COC NOFO

Theresa proposed a framework for prioritizing HUD NOFO projects. Please see slides 22 – 26 for the presentation. Slide headings are summarized here for easy reference:

- Purpose & Background/Context
- Recommendations for Projects/Priorities
- Leveraging System Level KPIs
- Leveraging Subpopulation Deep Dives

Comments, concerns, and questions from the discussion are captured on slide 21. Topic areas are summarized here for easy reference:

- Question about prevention measures in place,
- Feedback that there is not enough data to prioritize adult-only families,
- Concern about LGBTQ/transgender access to housing,
- Concern about youth access to PSH,
- Concern about veteran access to housing,
- Feedback to connect RRH clients to TAH, and
- Concern that DV providers need more flexibility

A poll was administered to determine if the Committee could proceed with the ICH recommendations for HUD CoC NOFO Priorities, as adjusted during the discussion. Poll results on HUD NOFO priorities are captured on slide 30.

• The Co-Chairs indicated that it made the most sense to move forward with prioritization criteria based on the poll results.
