The meeting started with a moment of silence in memory of Waldon Adams, who was killed in a car accident last weekend. Waldon was a valued member of the Interagency Council on Homelessness and a fierce advocate in the work to end homelessness.

- Point in Time Count report Elisabeth Young, Molly Vetter, and Tyrell McQueen reviewed the results of 2021 Point in Time Count. There were then some comments in the chat and verbally. Elisabeth confirmed that PEP-V households were included in the count. Wes Heppler also noted that the reduction in families is likely because so many families moved into rapid rehousing (RRH) and he reminded everyone that there is now a large number of families in RRH. As the public health emergency comes to an end, it will be important to understand what happens next with those families. There were also comments that the decrease in the number of family homelessness was also likely due to COVID factors and the eviction moratorium. There was also concern about the increase in percentage of chronic homelessness for individuals and a request to dive deeper into the reasons for that increase. Kristy Greenwalt said that the assumptions in Homeward DC 2.0 did assume a higher number of chronic homelessness.
- Federal funds available Tania Mortenson then reviewed the presentation related to new federal funds for Emergency Rental Assistance, totaling about \$350 million. Theresa Silla also presented information about benefits available under new federal legislation and resources from Catholic Charities to help people navigate the IRS process. There was a question about how information is getting out to people experiencing homelessness. Rachel Pierre said DMPED and DHCD are taking the lead in spreading the word and there should be radio, TV, and door to door outreach coming in the upcoming months.
