* What

Mental Health Community Residential Facilities (MHCRF)

- ✓ A publicly- or privately-owned community residential facility that provides twentyfour hour (24 hour) supervised care and a home-like environment in a house or apartment building for individuals, age eighteen (18 or older:
 - With a principal diagnosis of mental illness
 - Who require twenty-four hour (24 hour) onsite staff supervision, monitoring, personal assistance with activities of daily living, lodging, meals, and
 - Who are not in the custody of the Department of Corrections.
- Governed by Title 22-A DCMR, Chapter 38

Levels of Care (LOC)

- IR Intensive Residence Consumers with medical fragility who require supervised living
- SRR Supportive Residence Consumers requiring more specialized services and/or overnight monitoring
- ✓ SR Supportive Residence Consumers requiring supervision
- TSR Transitional Supportive Residence Consumers receive supports and skillsbuilding to transition into an apartment in twelve (12) months or less



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* Where

- CRFs are located in the District
- Licensed by DBH
- Just over 100 CRFs; 600 Beds

Who

- Consumers in the public behavioral health system
- Consumers connected to a Core Service Agency (CSA)
- Consumers transitioning from:
 - Saint Elizabeths Hospital
 - ✓ Community
 - \checkmark Incarceration
 - ✓ Apartment Living
 - Nursing Facility



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* When & How

- CSA or Saint Elizabeths submits a CRF Application
 Packet to DBH for review
- > DBH issues Level of Care Certificate (LOCC)
- CSA works with Consumer to schedule interviews at CRFs with vacancies
- CSA applies for Optional State Payment (OSP) to supplement SSA benefits for CRF room and board
