

1st Cohort

- Total interviewed: 41
- Total selected: 28
- Total dropped out: 2
- Completed training as of 2/24:
- Training to be completed this week: 2



Training Highlights

- 20 hour training hosted by DHS
 & DC Health
- Extremely impactful
- 100% of participants indicated they felt prepared after training & it was helpful

Initial Outcomes

- 96% passed the final exam
- Over 50% have received the vaccine
- 9 people fit criteria for rapid rehousing
- 18 peers completed SNAP E & T assessment; 5 people have followed up
- 100% of Peers Report training gave the knowledge and information needed to be an effective COVID-19 Peer Educator in shelter.
- All of the peers have begun engaging with other shelter residents

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Capital Improvement Updates



801 East

. Construction:

- DGS started construction this fall.
- The Design Build Team has received all building permit approvals except for DC Water and DOEE.
- \sim Anticipated completion date is Winter 2021/22

. Employment

- Meeting with contractor to finalize event dates
- Prep meetings will be scheduled before the contractor comes on site
- Goal of hiring in April







Pat Handy

- Clients will be temporary relocated to 1009 11th Street- former youth hostel.
- Relocation is expected to take place Early to Mid March, 2021
- Design is expected to take 10 months.
- Construction is expected to take 6 months after award of construction contract.







NYA

- DGS has identified potential site for New York Ave Replacement Shelter and is awaiting approval.
- DGS has prepared solicitation for design.
- * As soon as DHS receives approval, DHS will partner with ICH to start community engagement in order to receive recommendations from stakeholders.







Harriet Tubman Shelter

- DGS has identified potential site for new Harriet Tubman Replacement Shelter and is awaiting approval.
- * DGS is preparing solicitation for design.
- * As soon as DHS receives approval, DHS will partner with ICH to start community engagement in order to receive recommendations from stakeholders.
- Date for opening of New Facility is TBD.







Emery

- Demolition and Abatement work has been completed.
- Sitework is ongoing at the rear of building.
- Anticipated completion is June/July 2021.

Blair

- DCRA Building Permit has been obtained.
- Construction will begin after Emery is completed and after clients have been relocated from Blair to Emery.
- Construction duration is 7 months.







Ward 1 STFH- The Terrell

- Contractor has completed all major interior and exterior work.
- All building inspections have been completed.
- DHS anticipates opening of facility to clients in April of 2021.

Trends/Notes



- Continued to engage in daily wellness checks and comfort items distribution.
- Noted some increase in number of on-demand transports.
- More clients refusing to go to shelter during morning and afternoon hours. Most transports occurring during evening and overnight.
