




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#### **Homeward DC 2.0**



- Homeless Services Reform Act (HSRA) requires ICH to develop a strategic plan every five years.
- HDC 2.0 builds on progress and lessons learned during the first four years of implementation, as identified in the Homeward DC Progress Report
  - Approved by this body in March 2019

#### Plan Development Process



- Strategic Planning Committee has been supporting development of the plan since early 2019
- System Modeling (Chapter 2)
  - Abt Associates worked with ICH staff to develop a more dynamic modeling tool
  - TCP supported ICH staff by compiling data needed to inform system modeling
  - Received support from CAHP (Individuals) and Family System Work Groups to review data and help generate assumptions
- Strategies (Chapter 3)
  - Strategic Planning Ad Hoc Work Groups met throughout summer and fall to generate strategy recommendations





#### Plan Development Process (cont.)



- Accepted additional comments and suggested edits following 1/21 ICH full Council meeting.
- \* Suggestions brought forward to 2/25 Strategic Planning meeting for discussion.
- Final edits incorporated in version circulated for today's meeting.
- Strong support by members of the Strategic Planning Committee to move the plan forward to the full Council for adoption.





## Key Changes/Additions Since Jan 21 Mtg.



- System Modeling (Chapter 2): Reconciliation of our Housing Inventory Count (HIC) had a slight impact on the estimate of projected units needed.
  - The estimate of new units needed each year includes an assumption about the number of housing opportunities we should be getting based on turnover of our existing inventory.
  - > Tables on p. 25, 31, 33, and 35.






### **Key Changes/Additions (cont.)**



- Strategies (Chapter 3):
  - Addition of Goal 11: Expand Data Collection & Improve Data Quality
  - Addition of Goal 12: Provide Leadership on Creating a Right to Housing in the U.S.
  - Additional strategies (across the 12 goals) on racial equity.
  - Lead and supporting agencies identified for each strategy.
- Finalized Program Models Appendix to distinguish among different PSH models.

#### Plan Release


- Plan will proceed throughout copy edit, layout, and final EOM approval.
- Plan will be available publicly once the Mayor releases it (we will share a date when we have it).

#### <u>Implementation</u>

- Implementation must be phased; we do not have the bandwidth or resources to implement all strategies at once.
- Initial conversation about FY20/21 priorities at February Executive Committee meeting.
  - Committees are currently developing work plans.
  - Final work plans will be reviewed by Executive Committee at April meeting.

# **DC Workforce Investment Council (WIC)**

- Established by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)
- Business-led Board, appointed by the Mayor (34 members)
- Coordination, Oversight, Resources, Innovation





# Workforce Investment & Opportunity Act (WIOA)

DC is a **Single-State Entity under WIOA**, which means we function a little differently than states with State and Local workforce Boards.

Key functions of a healthy workforce system should provide:

- Leadership to the education and workforce system to create Sustainable Change
- An established and communicated Vision for the workforce system
- Development of Strategic Partnerships that achieve the vision
- Data and accountability systems to Keep the System Accountable to the vision
- Ensure workforce customers can Access the Assistance they Need
- Administer the core workforce programs offered
- Engage Employers and industry in preparing workers for available jobs



# **Key Challenges We Have Heard**

#### Alignment & Coordination Across Government

- Not sure who can help meet needs & how
- Employer engagement is not coordinated; lots of outreach

#### Provider & Pipeline Quality

- Individuals completing programs not gaining employment
- Employers not able to fill needs or retain employees

#### Data and Information

- CBOs are unclear where to send residents, or how to know if needs are being met upon referral
- Lack of data about how well the overall system is working and meeting residents' needs

# **WIOA State Plan Background**

#### District of Columbia's 4-year WIOA State Plan: 2016-2019

- WIOA passed in 2014
- States required to submit plan for use of WIOA funding
- DC's Initial WIOA State Plan was submitted in March 2016

#### Reviewed and modified in 2018

- This was intended to be a minor modification to the 4 year plan; a midpoint adjustment
- The two year modification was submitted in April 2018

#### 2020-2023 State Plan Requirement

- A more comprehensive update of the plan is due, to include district's vision, goals, and details on how those goals will be achieved
- Due March 2020
- Currently open for public comment; will be submitted in coming weeks to US Departments of Labor and Education





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#### **COVID-19 Planning**



- Mayor's Order 2020-035, District Govt
   Preparations for Coronavirus (COVID-19), issued on Feb 28.
  - Nine interagency working groups established, including one on Special and At-Risk Populations.
- DHS is working closely with DC Health, HSEMA, and Unity Healthcare, based on CDC and HUD guidance, to develop policy decisions and plans for the homeless services system.

- DHS held an initial training on the basics for providers and partners on Friday, March 6.
- DHS will host follow up briefing for providers and partners at 3:00pm on Wednesday, March 11. WebEx and call info will be shared via the ICH.
