Us Helping US, People Into Living Inc. awarded \$250,000 for Project GROWTH, a Wrap-Around Workforce Development Program for Transgender, Non-Binary, and Gender Non-Conforming Youth Program

The Family Services Administration - Youth Services Division of the DC Department of Human Services has awarded Us Helping Us, People Into Living, Inc.'s Project GROWTH a grant for \$250,000 to create a wrap-around workforce development program for transgender, non-binary, and non-conforming (TGNC) identifying youth, ages eighteen (18) to twenty four (24) years old in the District, who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of experiencing homelessness. The primary goal of Project GROWTH is to eliminate barriers to employment by providing TGNC youth with a formidable set of tools – trainings and certifications – and professional work experience necessary to transition into living-wage careers as adults.

Specifically, **Project GROWTH** will include: (1) place-based employment opportunities with TGNC-affirming, multi-sector agencies and organizations in Washington, DC; (2) personalized, career-buttressing professional development opportunities; (3) didactic certifications (and applicable) trainings in, but not limited to, Microsoft Office, phlebotomy, HIV counseling, testing and referral, and community health worker; (4) monthly professional development trainings and trainings focused on soft skills; and (5) case-managed wraparound services. These work readiness and professional development opportunities will be coupled with the planning, implementation and evaluation of community events and community service opportunities.
