

FY2018 WINTER PLAN: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q1.WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE WINTER PLAN?

The Winter Plan is intended to ensure the District has a comprehensive and coordinated response to protect District residents experiencing homelessness from cold weather injury. The plan describes how District agencies and community providers coordinate to provide hypothermia shelter and other services.

Q2. WHAT CONDITIONS TRIGGER HYPOTHERMIA ALERTS?

Hypothermia services begin whenever the actual or forecasted temperature, including the wind chill factor, is 32 degrees Fahrenheit or below. DHS will also call an overnight hypothermia alert when: the temperature is forecasted to be 40 degrees or below AND the forecasted chance of precipitation is 50% or greater. Hypothermia season is November 1- March 31, although a hypothermia alert can be called outside of this period.

Q3. HOW IS A HYPOTHERMIA ALERT CALLED?

Daily consultations are held between the District's Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency (HSEMA) and meteorologists at the National Weather Service (NWS) in Sterling, Virginia to determine real time weather conditions and the likely conditions in the next 24 hours.

Before 7 AM each day, HSEMA and DHS determine whether a daytime alert should be called, beginning at 7:00 AM. The alert is called if the actual or forecasted temperature, including wind chill, is or will be 32 degrees Fahrenheit (F.) or below. When the alert is called designated severe weather and low barrier shelters remain open as warming spaces until the HSEMA calls off the alert. HSEMA and DHS will continue to monitor the NWS forecast throughout the day.

By 2:30p-3:00p each day, based on both real time and forecasted conditions, HSEMA and DHS make a determination on whether to call an overnight alert. The alert is called if actual or forecasted temperature, including wind chill, is or will be at/below 32 degrees Fahrenheit OR temperature is forecasted to be 40 degrees or below AND the forecasted chance of precipitation is 50% or greater. When the alert is called hypothermia shelters will be open from the evening until 6:59 am the next morning.

Low-Barrier Shelters – operate year round; may include additional capacity for hypothermia alert nights **Seasonal Shelters** – open beginning the first night an alert is called, through March 31, 2018

Hypothermia Alert Night Shelters – open only on nights when an alert has been called. Sites in Recreation Centers open at 9:00 PM; sites in churches and community-based buildings open at 7:00 PM.

Overflow Shelters – operate only when all other shelters are near capacity and are not listed here to prevent individuals from seeking shelter at locations that are not open.

Q6. WHERE CAN I ACCESS SHELTER? FOR FAMILIES

D.C. General, apartment style shelter, and motels under contract with DHS will serve as the primary placement sites for families seeking emergency shelter. All family shelter, including D.C. General and overflow motel placements, operates 24 hours a day.

Q7. WHERE CAN I ACCESS SHELTER? FOR A MINOR OR YOUTH

Contact the DC Runaway and Homeless Youth Hotline: (202)-547-7777.

This is the 24 hour hotline to call when an unaccompanied minor is identified (e.g., via street outreach or other system partners) or otherwise presents for assistance anywhere in the community. RHY Hotline staff will identify a staff person to pick up the minor within 30 minutes, conduct an initial screening, and determine appropriate next steps.

Q8. HOW DO I ACCESS TRANSPORT TO SHELTER?

On-demand transportation is provided only before and after timeframes for scheduled transportation. Call the DC Shelter Hotline at (202) 399-7093.

For scheduled transport, see tables below.

Note the following limitations when reviewing the schedules:

- All listed times are estimates, subject to change due to traffic conditions and winter weather challenges, including snow emergencies and ice. Safety is the primary concern;
- Destinations for morning transportation are subject to change based on availability of the site and/or actual numbers of persons seeking to go to a specific destination.
- Accessible transportation for persons with disabilities is provided upon request; and
- Unscheduled (on-demand) transportation outside of the schedule is limited, and subject to the conditions traffic conditions and winter weather challenges noted above.
