

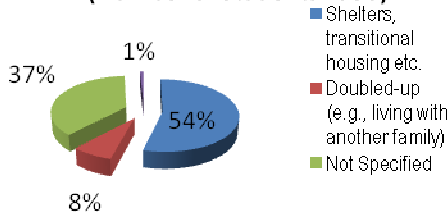
OVERVIEW OF THE MCKINNEY-VENTO HOMELESS CHILDREN & YOUTH (MKV) PROGRAM

Transitory Services

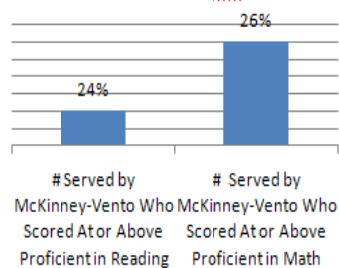
The Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) works collaboratively with local liaisons, community organizations, and groups representing homeless children, youth, and families to eliminate potential barriers to success in school. Program activities include the collection of valid, reliable, and comprehensive information on the problems faced by homeless children/youth and the barriers they must overcome to regularly attend school. OSSE uses this critical information to support collaborative efforts to address the basic needs of these students and to generally improve the provision of comprehensive services to these children/youth and their families. The information collected also enables OSSE to assess the gap between program capacity and student need. This year OSSE has worked collaboratively with other agencies to identify local educational agencies (LEAs) with the greatest need in order to ensure that materials, such as clothing, food, and school supplies, were appropriately distributed. In addition, OSSE provides technical assistance to LEAs, in coordination with local liaisons, to ensure LEA compliance on such issues as school choice and placement, enrollment policies, enrollment disputes, school records, duties of local liaisons, and reviewing and revising policies that may act as enrollment barriers. OSSE has used its portion of this federal grant to address the greatest identified barrier for homeless children and youth in the District- transportation costs. Finally, OSSE staff monitors local LEAs to ensure compliance with the MKV program. **Local educational agencies within the District of Columbia are eligible to apply for funding made available under the McKinney Vento Program (Subtitle VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act; reauthorized by Title X, Part C of the ESEA as reauthorized).**

Primary Night Time Residency SY08-09

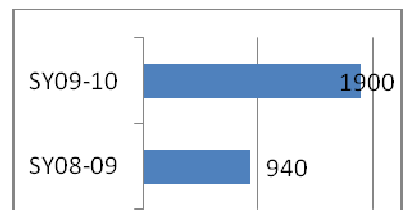
(Number of Students =950)
